Role Summary

Make a difference in the academic lives of children and youth at Tubman by helping them with school assignments. Volunteers assist youth in the shelter and transitional housing with homework, creating a unique plan for each child to support their individual academic needs and goals.

Position Responsibilities

- Provide one-on-one assistance to children with their homework and academic skills
- Create and facilitate academic activities for the children
- Model non-violent conflict resolution skills

- Mature judgment, ability to maintain professional boundaries
- Strong emotional stability, ability to be patient and build rapport with children and youth
- Excellent communication skills
- Experience working with youth and ability to provide a safe, non-judgmental atmosphere
- Flexibility regarding attendance with children and teens that are in crisis

• Commit to one shift a week on Tuesdays or Thursdays from 4-5pm

- Attend Tubman's five part Volunteer/Intern Orientation and Training series
- Supervision provided by a Youth and Family Services staff person
