#### Position & Responsibilities

#### **Role Summary**

The Civil Legal Advocate Intern or Volunteer is responsible for attending Order for Protection hearings in Hennepin or Washington County, assisting with the writing and filing of Orders for Protection at Tubman, performing legal research, and completing necessary tasks for trial preparation.

- Provide information and support, helping clients explore their legal options
- Learn about legal issues concerning domestic violence and the civil court process
- Gain practical experience and learn about the vital role of the legal department in a nonprofit organization

# **Position Responsibilities**

- Assist clients with writing Orders for Protection and follow up with the Service Center/Court Administration and Sheriff's Department to complete the filing process
- Attend civil court hearings with clients who are seeking Orders for Protection
- Provide emotional support and answer questions clients may have about the process
- Ability to determine professional boundaries on a legal scale, including maintaining confidentiality and discerning needed information
- Assist with legal research and trial preparation when needed

- Must be familiar with the Order for Protection rules and regulations
- Must be a second or third year law student
- Ability and willingness to listen actively and respond appropriately to clients
- Ability to work with diverse teams and clients to foster a culturally inclusive environment
- Must have own transportation
