Position & Responsibilities

Role Summary

Youth Advocates in the *Safe Journeys* Shelter work at Tubman's Maplewood location alongside staff to serve youth and young adults of all genders between the ages of 13-24 (as well as their children) who have been exposed to relationship violence, dating violence, sexual assault and/or stalking, including individuals who are homeless, runaways, or have experienced sex trafficking.

Impact & Benefits

- Make a difference in a young person's life by listening to and advocating for their needs
- Practice supportive crisis intervention and conflict resolution techniques to foster growth and resilience within youth who have experienced sexual trauma, violence, or exploitation

Position Responsibilities

- Build trusting relationships with youth and young adults while maintaining confidentiality and appropriate professional boundaries
- Foster a safe and empowering environment and practice advocacy to support youth who have experienced trauma or violence
- Communicate and collaborate with colleagues to provide coordinated services to youth and families, following agency guidelines to administer safety planning, crisis intervention, supporting safety, recreation, school, and planning for self-identified goals

Qualifications & Expectations

Position Qualifications:

- Experience working with youth and young adults
- Knowledge and understanding of homelessness and sex trafficking
- Ability and willingness to listen actively and respond respectfully and appropriately to youth, young adults, and their children, and to make necessary judgment regarding health and safety
- Excellent communication and people skills, including emotional stability and patience
- Ability to work with diverse teams and clients to foster a culturally inclusive environment
- Comfortable working under pressure, able to remain calm in response to difficult situations

Time Commitment & Availability

- Weekday afternoon and evening availability preferred
- Commit to 10 hours per week for a minimum of four months

Supervision & Training

- Attend Tubman's five-part Volunteer/Intern Orientation and Training series
- Supervision provided by the Director of Youth and Family Services as well as a staff supervisor
